MOTIVATIONAL INTERVIEWING

Uses strategies to encourage rapid, self-driven behavior change to end substance use and motivate entry into treatment.

MEDICATION ASSISTED TREATMENT

Medication Assisted Treatment is a patient-driven program that includes opioid therapy, a medical examination by a physician, individual counseling, drug screenings, and appropriate referrals. Referrals may include the following: 12-step meetings, vocational and/or educational training, and job placement.

OPIOID DEPENDENCY MEDICATIONS

Methadone, buprenorphine, and naltrexone are used to treat opioid dependence and addiction to shortacting opioids such as heroin, morphine, and codeine, as well as semi-synthetic opioids like oxycodone and hydrocodone. Medications utilized in MAT may be safely taken for months, years, or even a lifetime. Plans to stop a medication must always be discussed with a doctor.



COGNITIVE BEHAVIORAL THERAPY

Seeks to help patients recognize, avoid, and cope with the situations in which they are most likely to abuse drugs.

GROUP THERAPY

Helps patients face their substance use realistically, come to terms with its harmful consequences, while boosting motivation to stay drug free. Patients learn how to resolve emotional and personal problems without turning to substance use.

MOTIVATIONAL INCENTIVES

Utilizes positive reinforcement for remaining drug-free, for participating in counseling sessions, or for taking treatment medications as prescribed.
